The REACH Regulation (EC 1907/2006), which entered into force on 1 June 2007, was established by the European Union to ensure the safe use of chemicals and to aim for a high level of protection of human health and the environment. Under these provisions, all parties responsible for placing chemicals on the market are obliged to identify and manage the risks associated with the use of such substances.

Our company fully supports and implements all the requirements of the REACH Regulation. Another key objective of the regulation is to improve the exchange of information throughout the supply chain and to enhance transparency. As a "downstream user," we actively exchange information with our suppliers whenever necessary.

Under REACH, any chemical substance manufactured or imported in quantities of 1 tonne or more per year must be registered with the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA). However, there are certain exceptions to this requirement. According to the Guidance on Requirements for Substances in Articles (May 2008) published by ECHA, our products are defined as "articles" rather than "substances" and are therefore not subject to the registration obligation. Furthermore, the main components of our products, polymers, are currently exempt from registration requirements under REACH.

In this context, our products do not require registration, as REACH registration obligations apply only to substances and mixtures (preparations). There are no restrictions on the raw materials we use during the pre-registration and registration phases.
